Call for Service: Expert-Consultant in the Field of Engineering/Construction and Civil/Renovation Works

INTERNET ACCESS FLAGSHIP: Rural Empowerment through Digital Inclusion (REDI) is an EU-funded project that Solidarity Fund PL in Georgia (SFPL in GEO) began implementing on December 1st, 2023, together with our partner - the e-Governance Academy from Estonia (eGA). By virtue of its innovative approach, this action will reduce the existing digital division and include those traditionally left behind by improving access to affordable digital infrastructure and developing digital literacy skills in rural areas of the target regions of Imereti, Guria, Racha-Lechkhumi, Kvemo Svaneti and Kakheti.

When it comes to the development of the connectivity infrastructure, first of the two main directions of the project, it will be implemented as a follow-up of the Open-Net Programme's project "Log-in Georgia" and will focus on providing access to the Internet and technology to inhabitants of rural areas from ≈200 selected villages from target regions with a minimum effort required.

Second direction of the project is to establish 25 Digital Rural Hubs (DRHs) in the villages of Georgia. In order to go test the whole cycle of the activity, project team decided to pilot the establishment of seven (7) DRHs in 7 villages of Guria and Racha regions of Georgia. Each DRH will be set up in a single room, within existing community/municipal or other available buildings in each village. The selected rooms designated for the DRHs will require immediate civil (renovation) works to render them suitable for the establishment of the hubs. The renovation works will be carried out by the contracted renovation company. To ensure timely and high-quality completion of the renovation works, regular monitoring, evaluation and progress reporting by the field expert will be essential for the project team.

In this regard, the REDI team is seeking to establish a service contract with an expert-consultant who has extensive experience in the field of engineering/construction and civil/renovation works.

Service requested: Provide expert consultations for the project Rural Empowerment through Digital Inclusion (REDI).

Responsibilities:

- Oversee and monitor the renovation works conducted by the renovation service provider company to ensure compliance with technical specifications, project documentation, required scope of work, and quality standards.;

- Assess the completeness of the renovation works performed and provide reports (if necessary) on quality performance;

-Conduct periodic field visits to selected villages in Guria and Racha regions to monitor and evaluate renovation works;

- Analyze renovation/engineering plans, and technical documentation related to the renovation to ensure accuracy and feasibility; provide consultation to the customer and confirm the compliance of the works.

- Advise the REDI team on technical matters related to building renovation and engineering solutions and attend the meetings if necessary;

 Detect potential risks, delays, or deviations during the renovation process and provide recommendations for corrective actions; supervise the implementation team and provide them with instructions.
Verify that all renovation works are carried out in line with Georgian construction regulations;

- Be involved in the formal handover of completed works, including the final inspection and validation that the site is ready for the setup of the Digital Rural Hub.

1. Duration of the assignment:

During the year 2025 (until December 31 2025), with possible terms of extension upon mutual agreement no later than December 31, 2026.

2. Place(s) of Assignment

Selected expert-consultant will be required to conduct occasional field trip(s) to the selected villages of Guria and Racha regions. Online and in-person meetings in Tbilisi will also be required.

*The list of villages will be finalized at the signing stage of the contract.

3. Minimum requirements

3.1 Mandatory requirements:

- 3.1.1 Higher Education in Civil Engineering/Construction/Civil Works/Architecture and/or related fields from reputable Georgian and/or International University.
- 3.1.2 Minimum of 5 years of working experience in the field of Construction-Engineering/Civil Works/Architecture or related fields;
- 3.1.3 Working experience in Engineering/Construction/Civil Works monitoring, and building sites supervision;
- 3.1.4 Ability to conduct occasional field trips to the selected villages of the REDI target regions (Guria, Racha-Lechkhumi and Kvemo Svaneti).

3.2 Additional requirements:

- 3.2.1 Experience working with international donors/organizations <u>will be an asset;</u>
- 3.2.2 Good oral and written communication skills in English <u>will be an asset.</u>

Offers from service providers that do not meet the minimum mandatory criteria (3.1) will be rejected for formal reasons.

4. Assessment criteria for selection will be assessed based on the points provided (max. 80 points)

4.1 Experience - max. 30 points

4.1.1 Experience of working in the field of Civil Engineering/Construction/Civil Works/Architecture and/or related fields – **(15 points)**

- Over 10 years of experience 15 points
- 8 to 10 years of experience 10 points
- 5-7 years of experience- 5 points

4.1.2 Working experience in Engineering/Construction/Civil Works monitoring, and building sites supervision – (15 points)

- Over 5 years of experience 15 points
- 3-5 years of experience 10 points
- 1-2 years of experience- 5 points
- Less than 1 year of experience 0 points

4.2 Cost of service (one working day equals 8 hours) – max. 30 points

Cost should be provided in the designated field in the application form.

Assessment under the criterion "cost" will be processed based on the following formula:

P= Pmin/Pof x 30 points

where:

Pmin - the lowest proposed price

Pof – price presented in the examined offer

P – the number of points awarded to the examined offer under the price criterion, rounded to the full number.

The settlement between the contracting authority and the contractor shall be carried out in the euro equivalent in GEL, in accordance with the exchange rate established by the National Bank of Georgia.

4.3 Interview – max. 20 points

The interview process will be aimed at verifying the candidate's suitability for the position and execution of specific task(s) listed in the announcement.

Only shortlisted candidates will be invited for an interview.

6. The contracting authority will reject any tenders/questions submitted after the deadline for submission of tenders.

8. A contract will be signed with the selected contractor/contractors.

9. The Contractor(s) whose tender was selected as the most advantageous shall be informed by the Contracting Authority about the place and date of signing the contract.

10. Prior to concluding the contract, the Contractor shall provide all information necessary to complete the content of the contract at the request of the Contracting Authority.

11. If the Economic Operator(s) whose tender(s) was selected as the most advantageous evades the conclusion of the contract, the Contracting Authority may re-examine and evaluate the tenders from among the tenders of the remaining Economic Operators in the procedure or cancel the procedure.

12. Persons representing the Economic Operator at the time of signing the contract should present documents confirming their authorisation to represent the Economic Operator, if such authorisation does not result from the documents attached to the tender.
